PAYMENT AND CANCELLATIONS – If signed contract submission is received on or before June 1, 2014 the charge is \$425, if received after June 1, 2014 the charge is \$475 per 8' x 8' exhibit booth and is due upon contract submission. Exhibitors who cancel after July 15, 2015 will be obligated for 50% of the total booth rental fee (\$200) as liquidated damages. Exhibitors who cancel after August 1, 2015 will be obligated for full payment as liquidated damages. Failure to occupy booth space does not release the Exhibitor from obligation to pay the full cost of rental.
