LEGISLATIVE UPDATES



Although the Georgia General Assembly will remain in session through the end of March, below are some of the proposed bills currently being debated that may affect rehab professionals if voted on favorably by both the House and Senate.

Senate Bill 16 proposes to not only lower the percentage of cannabidiol in THC oil from 5% to 3%, but also add Autism Spectrum Disorder to the list of conditions for which individuals can use THC oil.

House Bill 280 proposes to permit weapons carry license holders to now carry and possess handguns on post-secondary education campuses such as technical schools, colleges and universities. Exemptions include child care facilities, student housing and at sporting events.

House Bill 220 proposes the Georgia Veterans Work Opportunity Tax Credit as a state income tax credit incentive that will be available to private sector employers who hire veterans.

House Bill 233 proposes that parking permits issued to individuals with disabilities include a recent photograph of the individual to whom the permit is issued.

House Bill 288 proposes the issuance of information cards to individuals with disabilities who own service animals which detail the rights of the individual, including their right to be accompanied by a service animal in public places subject to the conditions established by law. These information cards may also be issued to individuals who train service animals for individuals with disabilities.

House Bill 338 is the latest education bill to hit the floor and aims to address how to improve failing schools in Georgia. This bill proposes adding a system of supports including a Chief Turnaround Office and turnaround coaches to provide assistance to those schools that have been identified as low performing.

Senate Bill 5 aims to increase the amount of funds allocated by the Georgia Lottery to the Lottery for Education Account.

House Bill 343 proposes to amend the Official Code of Georgia Annotated to replace the terms "Mental Retardation" and "Mentally Retarded" with "Intellectual Disability."

Proposals should be designed for either a one (1.0) or one and a $\frac{1}{2}$ (1.5) hour general session or concurrent sessions for one (1.0) or one and a $\frac{1}{2}$ (1.5) hour duration. All concurrent sessions will be set up theater style with a podium. Please be sure to accurately complete the Audio/Visual Request Form included in the application.

Travel arrangements and accommodations will be discussed with those chosen to present.

Review Criteria for Proposals:

Overall quality;

Relevance to the field of rehabilitation;

Well-defined focus that can be presented in a 1 or 1.5 hour format;

Practical application of idea presented;

Originality and timeliness of idea;

Ethics presentations based on the CRC Code of Ethics should so indicate

Notification:

Notification of proposal inclusion will be provided to the primary presenter by June 1, 2017.

Instructions for Proposal Submission:

Complete entire application – Pages 4 through 8.

Please use the Call for Proposals form or an exact duplicate.

Please assure all information is clearly legible.

Do not exceed the space provided (<u>please do not add extra sheets except those</u> <u>containing presenter vita information</u>).

Handouts, if being used, must accompany program proposal applications. Handouts, including alternative formats for handouts, are the speakers' responsibilities to provide on-site.

Include a one-page resume or vita for each presenter.

- 7. Has this employer been instrumental in advocating for the employment of persons with disabilities? Does this employer inform rehabilitation service providers about employment possibilities that might be filled by persons with disabilities?

Letters of nomination should be one typed page or less.

THE SERVICE AWARD

This award is specially oriented toward honoring an individual for outstanding contribution(s) to the field of rehabilitation. The recipient does not have to be a member of the Georgia Rehabilitation Association and cannot be an employee of the Division of Rehabilitation Services. Consideration, criteria, and procedures for nominations:

- 1. What has the individual contributed towards advancement of the field of rehabilitation?
- 2. What special recognition or awards has the Nominee received?

Itemize articles or writings in professional publications.

One supporting letter should accompany the letter of nomination.

THE PROFESSIONAL ACHEIVEMENT AWARD

*Recipients of these two GRA awards will be selected by the GRCEA Division and will be judged on the basis of the NRA guidelines.
