2018 East Chapter Campaign for Caring

East Chapter Special Project Committee Members will begin preparing to work on the "2018 Campaign for Caring". Alfred Ely Beach High School is one of the oldest public high schools in Savannah, Georgia. In 1867, the Beach Institute was established by the Freedmen's Bureau with funds donated by Alfred Ely Beach, editor of Scientific American. By 1874, the institute was appropriated by the Savannah-Chatham Board of Education for the purpose of providing free education to Savannah's African American citizenry.

In 2017 Alfred Ely Beach High School celebrated its 150th Anniversary. The longstanding history of BHS still resonates with its students today; presently, Beach High School is open to residents of Chatham County grades 9-12.


